- Decide on the entries to be made and make a memorandum of the articles in the same order as they are found in the list.
 Fair Association reserves the right to refuse entries when space is unavailable.
- 3. No exhibitor will be paid more than two monies under one premium number.
- 4. Exhibitor definition for Groups: Where herd is registered in the name of different members of a family residing on one farm and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as a single exhibitor.
- 5. Registration papers are needed for livestock, except steers.
- 6. Do not ask to make entries after closing date.
- 7. This book is subject to corrections.
- 8. No Alcohol, Drugs or Firearms are permitted on the grounds.

PERMITS AND PRIVILEGES

- 1. Persons wishing to rent booths, stands and privileges to use any part of the Fairgrounds must submit an application to the Concessions and General Vendor Committee. Applications may be obtained by calling 713-865-0022.
- 2. No privilege will be granted for less than \$50.
- 3. All applications for space must be approved by the Concessions and General Vendor Committee and will be considered in order of their application.
- 4. The rate will be governed by location. There will be a standardized rate for all food concessionaires, including for-profit and not-for-profit entities.
- 5. All concession fees must be submitted with the application, prior to May 1. All general vendor fees must be paid prior to the first day of the Fair.
- 6. Each concessionaire or vendor must confine himself to the space allotted to him. There will be an additional fee for each additional trailer/truck electric hookup.
- 7. All concessionaires and vendors must provide current "Proof of Insurance" listing the Martinsville Agricultural Fair Association as an additionally insured party. If applicable they must provide copies of all certifications required by the Clark County Health Department.
- 8. Concessionaires and vendors must abide by the rules of the Association and terms of their agreement and licenses. Failure to do so, shall subject them to forfeiture of their privilege and lead to exclusion from the grounds without reimbursement.

ENTRIES

- Check each livestock department to see when entries should be made.
- 2. Check each department to see when animals must be in place.
- 3. Entry fees as above each class.
- Purebred animals must be registered with their respective breed association and papers held in readiness for checking by Superintendent of Department before, during or after animal is shown.
- 5. No animal will be permitted to roam at large on grounds.
- 6. All protests must be in writing, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth the grounds for protesting. Protests against exhibition of either animal or articles must be filed with the Secretary on day of contest. In every case of protest the parties protesting must deposit a sum of money equal to the amount of the purse. In the event of the protest being sustained it shall be returned to the complaintant and if the protest shall not be sustained the sum shall be forfeited to the Board.
- 7. No Exhibitor will be paid more than two monies in any one class.
- 8. All animals must be under control by owner or person in charge at all times.



A FEW RULES WORTH OBSERVING

- If you have entries to make, attend to it at once and when your stock or articles are entered see that they are in readiness at the proper time and place for examination by the committee or by the judge.
- Accept no rumor in regard to the business of exhibition. If you do not know what to do, inquire of the officer whose duty it is to tell you. One-half the disappointment and trouble at the Fair is occasioned by relying on hearsay. Attend to your business. If it is wrong, you know where the blame is.
- 3. Read the rules and by example assist in enforcing them, but do not forget that mistakes will occur where thousands are congregated. The Board endeavors to do justice to all.
- 4. The success of the coming fair depends largely upon the manner in which the public patronizes it.

POLICE REGULATIONS

The Clark County Sheriff and the Martinsville Police Department shall have general police supervision on the grounds. They shall have full charge of the police force in the employ of the Fair management, except as otherwise provided subject to order of the Board of Directors.

All officers and policemen shall be sworn in as conservators of the peace and it shall be their duty to arrest any person creating a disturbance or violating any of the rules or regulations of the fair or the laws of the state.

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

- Entries are open to all boys and girls who are at least eight (8) years of age, or in third grade, and not yet 21 years of age on or before September 1 of the year previous to the fair.
- Entries for the Junior Swine Show will close at noon on Tuesday, June 27.
 Entries for the Junior Steer Show will close at noon on Thursday, June 29.
 Entries for the Junior Goat Show will close at noon on Friday, June 30.
- 3. Beef, Swine & Goats to be shown in both the Junior Show and the Open Show must be on the grounds for 72 hours. If showing in the Junior Show only, animals are not required to be on the grounds for 72 hours.
- 4. Health regulations are the same as for the Open Show.
- 5. All animals shown in the Junior Show must be the property of the boys or girls showing them. If the animals are shown in both the Junior and Open Shows, they shall be shown under the same exhibitor's name. (For example: A boy or girl is not permitted to show an animal in the Junior Show and a friend or relative show the same animal in the Open Show).
- 6. Each exhibitor must show his/her own stock. If an exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, the other animal must be shown by an assistant who is also a junior exhibitor.
- 7. Showmanship age based on exhibitor age as of September 1, of the previous
- 8. Each exhibitor will be required to purchase an exhibitor's ticket unless he/she has already purchased an exhibitor's ticket for the Open Show.
- 9. No exhibitor will be paid more than two monies per class.
- Livestock will be identified by ear tags, ear notches, tattoos, color markings or any other types of identification honored by breed associations.

2023 Exhibition Livestock Health Requirements County Fairs GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

These Exhibition Health Requirements apply to all livestock present at the fair including those animals that are not entered in competitive events.

- 1. Exhibitors are required to familiarize themselves with all rules applicable to their exhibits. All out-of-state animals shall require an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php
- All animals, except as noted, shall be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) which shows that the animals meets all health requirements for the State of Illinois. CVI's shall be made available to Bureau of Animal Health Personnel on request. CVI means a legible record made on an official form from the state of origin which has been issued, signed and dated by an accredited veterinarian and which shows the name and address of the animal's owner or exhibitor and the results of all required tests or vaccinations. A CVI shall list only one animal identification per line; shall be presented on the form on which it was initially issued; and shall not be corrected, changed or altered in
- 3. All animals shall be officially identified. The animal(s) official identification shall be recorded on the CVI.
- 4. If animals are from tuberculosis accredited, brucellosis certified, pseudorabies qualified, or brucellosis validated herds, the identifying herd number(s) along with the date of the last herd test(s) shall appear on the CVI.
- 5. CVI for out-of-state livestock shall be void thirty (30) days after issuance.
- 6. CVI for Illinois-origin livestock shall be void ninety (90) days after issuance.
- 7. All livestock shall be subject to examination upon entry to any Illinois fair or exhibition. Any animal showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases shall be immediately withdrawn and held in quarantine at the owner's risk and expense until properly treated and recovered, or until the animal is released to return to the owner's premise.
 - Any livestock infected with scabies, mange, active lesions of ringworm, soremouth, or multiple warts which are easily visible without close examination shall not be permitted to exhibit and are subject to quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
 - Sheep and goats with caseous lymphadenitis as evidenced by draining abscesses shall not be exhibited and are subject to immediate quarantine or removal from the fairgrounds.
- 8. Illinois Department of Agriculture personnel or designee may collect blood, tissue, milk or urine samples from any animal being exhibited and/or raced at any Illinois fair to test for the presence of illegal drugs. New examination techniques, such as ultrasound, may also be used at anytime while the animals are on the grounds of any Illinois fair or exhibit. The Illinois Department of Agriculture or designee may collect urine, blood, tissue or other test samples from exhibition animals at the time of slaughter.
- 9. All exhibitors of animals at any Illinois fair or exhibition shall comply with the provisions of the Illinois Humane Care for Animals Act. If violations are observed, the animal(s) will be excused from exhibition and ordered removed from the grounds with all rewards being
 - Any practice or deviation from normal, accepted care, including physical, medical or mechanical application, shall constitute a violation of show rules and may result in the animal(s) disqualification and removal from the fairgrounds.
- 10. Any Illinois cattle, bison, cervidae or goats being exhibited in non-accredited free states must be isolated from the remainder of the herd/flock upon return to Illinois and retested for tuberculosis 60-120 days post-entry.

CATTLE

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be either a fully healed and legible tattoo, official metal ear tag, registration number (can only be used if the tattoo is recorded on the registration certificate or for breeds where pictures are acceptable), or individual brands, if brand is recorded on the registration certificate.

Illinois Cattle

Brucellosis

Illinois is a Bovine Brucellosis Class-Free State. Brucellosis testing is not required for Illinois cattle.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tuberculin testing is not required for

Please note: Illinois steers and calves under 6 months of age are not required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

Out-of-State-Cattle

All out-of-state cattle are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

- Female cattle six (6) months of age and older and bulls eighteen (18)
 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis
 within thirty (30) days prior to entry, unless exempt by one (1) of the
 following:
 - A. Originate directly from a certified brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Official vaccinates of dairy breeds under twenty (20) months of age or official vaccinates of beef breeds under twenty-four (24) months of age.
 - C. Animal originated from a "Class Free" state (if entire state is so classified)
 - D. Steers and spayed heifers are not required to be tested for brucellosis and pseudorabies.
 - E. Brucellosis and pseudorabies testing are not required in Illinois.
- The negative brucellosis test shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory within 30 days prior to exhibition.

Tuberculosis

- 1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States
 - A. No tuberculin test required. All cattle, including steers, originating from an Accredited Tuberculosis Free State, may enter Illinois for exhibition when accompanied by a CVI issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days
- 2. Non Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. Cattle must originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to an additional tuberculin test conducted within 30 days prior to exhibition.
 - C. Cattle that enter Illinois for exhibition and remain in Illinois (animal does not return to the state of origin within 30 days) must be isolated and retested for TB 60-120 days from the last official TB test date.

SWINE

Illinois Swine

Identification

- Swine shall be identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- Ear notch identification is acceptable for barrows, crossbred gilts and breeding swine.

(Note: Ear notch identification of crossbred swine does not satisfy USDA identification requirements for interstate movement or official testing.)
Brucellosis & Pseudorabies

Brucellosis & pseudorabies testing is not required for Illinois swine.

Out-of-State Swine

All out-of-state swine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at:

- Individually identified by an official ear tag, tattoo or recognized breed ear notch.
- 2. Ear notch identification is not acceptable for crossbred animals.

Brucellosis

- 1. Breeding swine 4 months of age and older shall be negative to an official test for brucellosis within 30 days prior to exhibition unless exempt by one (1) of the following:
 - A. Originate immediately and directly from a brucellosis-free herd.
 - B. Originate directly from a validated brucellosis-free state.
- Swine brucellosis test for exhibition shall be conducted at a state or federal laboratory.

Pseudorabies

- 1. Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage IV or V state are exempt from the pseudorabies testing requirement.
- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage III state shall be negative to an official test for pseudorabies conducted within thirty (30) days prior to entry or originate immediately and directly from a qualified pseudorabies negative herd.
- Swine originating from a Pseudorabies Stage I or II state shall be nedative at an official test for pseudorabies conducted within the 10 days prior to entry.
- Barrows and females in market classes must meet the same requirements as breeding swine.

SHEEP

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Ear tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapic Record Database.

Market Lambs

All wethers must be slick shorn (show ring ready) before weigh-in so that lamb fungus can be identified.

Illinois Sheep

- Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected
 or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Sheep

All out-of-state sheep are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by call the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at: http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/animalregistry/login.php

- 1. Sheep originating from a flock that has previously been classified as either an infected or source flock can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved flock plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

GOATS

Identification

Individual identification of each animal shall be by an ear tattoo or official metal or plastic tag. A microchip ID is acceptable if the owner provides the reader.

Tattoos may be used when a registration certificate, listing the tattoo number, accompanies the animal.

When using ear tags, the tag must indicate the premises ID and state of origin. The tag number must be assigned by a state or APHIS representative and recorded in the Scrapic Record Database.

Ears should be used for tattoing when possible. If there is no space in the ear, the flank or tail fold may be used.

Illinois Goats

- Goats originating from a herd that he previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

Out-of-State Goats

All out-of-state goats are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by calling Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944. Permits may also be obtained online at http://www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW.animalregistry/login.php

- 1. Goats originating from a herd that has previously been classified as either an infected or source herd can be exhibited in Illinois upon the completion of an approved herd plan.
- 2. Tuberculosis Goats from areas or states that are not Accredited Bovine Tuberculosis Free, must be accompanied by a CVI indicating that the goats originated from a herd where a complete negative herd test had been conducted within the past twelve (12) months and the individual animals are negative to a tuberculin test conducted with in thirty (30) days prior to entry. For any animal born after 1/1/2002, the CVI must include the flock of birth and the flock of origin, if different.

HORSES, PONIES, MULES AND OTHER EQUIDAE

Illinois Equine

- All horses and other equidae, twelve (12) months of age and older attending an advertised equine event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- An advertised equine event means a show, rodeo, sale, auction, exhibition, trail ride, or horse fair that is posted or media promoted.

4. A CVI is not required for Illinois equine.

Out-of-State Equine

All out-of-state equine are to be accompanied by an entry permit. Entry permit numbers are available by event, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.

- 1. All horses and other equidae entering Illinois that are twelve (12) months of age or older, shall be accompanied by a negative test for equine infectious anemia (EIA) conducted within the last twelve (12) months. A copy of this test shall accompany the animal.
- 2. AGID (Coggins) or ELISA tests are accepted.
- 3. All horses and other equidae shall be accompanied by a CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to entry.

POULTRY

- All entries (except waterfowl, i.e. domesticated fowl that normally swim, such as ducks and geese) in a show or exhibition shall have originated from a U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent hatchery or flock OR have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days prior to exhibition. Exhibitor shall show proper information as to name and address of owner or exhibitor, name and address of the authorized testing agent, date of the testing and the number, breed, and species of those tested.
- Prior to being used to transport poultry to a show, all crates, boxes, containers and vehicles shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected.
- 3. Any poultry vaccinations must be performed at least 4 weeks prior to delivery to the show.
- 4. Upon admission to a show, all entries shall be examined by the official county fair veterinarian or qualified state personnel who shall also receive and examine all certificates necessary for admission of birds to a show. Birds not in show condition will be excused from exhibition and removed from the premises. Any fowl showing signs of illness during the fair will be removed from the exhibition grounds.
- 5. All out-of-state turkeys must originate from flocks that are officially classified as U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum Clean in accordance with the provisions of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or be negative to a test for Mycoplasma gallisepticum within 30 days prior to entry.
- 6. A permit is also required for out-of-state poultry. A permit may be obtained by calling (217) 782-4944.

Please note: these poultry exhibition requirements do not apply to 4-H and FFA 1-day poultry shows where the entries are taken to the show and returned home the same day. However, a permit is required for out-of-state poultry.

CERVIDAE

(Deer, Elk, Reindeer, Caribou, Moose, Red Deer and other Related Species)

Identification

All animals shall be individually identified with an approved tag, microchip or tattoo. Elk are required to have two official/approved unique identifiers.

Illinois Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

For cervidae changing ownership or moving within the State, the owner must obtain a permit issued by the Department prior to movement and the cervid must originate from a herd that is enrolled in the Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Program or the Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Program. The permit shall be obtained no more than 72 hours in advance of the movement of the cervids by providing the following information:

- A) Name and complete mailing address of person exhibiting the cervids;
- B) Certified Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease or Contained Monitored Chronic Wasting Disease Herd number;
- Name and complete mailing address of location where the animals will be exhibited;
- D) Number of animals and unique identification of the animals.

Tuberculosis

Illinois is an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free State. Tyberculin test is not required for Illinois Cervidae.

Out-of-State Cervidae

Chronic Wasting Disease

- All cervidae entering Illinois must be in compliance with the Illinois Wildlife Code [520 ILCS 5]. For more information, contact the Illinois Department of Natural Resources at 217/782-6384
- 2. All cervidae entering Illinois must be accompanied by a permit from the Department and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that:
 - a. has been issued by an accredited veterinarian of the state of origin or a veterinarian in the employ of the United States Department of Agriculture;
 - b. is approved by the Animal Health Official of the state of origin;
 - c. shows that the cervidae are free from visible evidence of any contagious, infectious or communicable disease or exposure thereto, do not originate from a CWD endemic area (any county and surrounding counties where CWD has been diagnosed in the fast five years);
 - d. shows that the cervidae are not originating from a herd under quarantine for any contagious, infectious or communicable disease;
 - e. shows that the animals originate from a herd that has been monitored for at least 5 years under a state-approved CWD certification program.
- A permit number can be obtained my calling (217) 782-4944. Applicant for permit shall furnish the following information to the Department:
 - a. Name and post office mailing address of Illinois destination;
 - Name and post office mailing address of the consignor and/or source herds;
 - c. Name and post office mailing address of the herd veterinarian;
 - d. Number and unique identification of cervidae in shipment.

Rrucellosis

Out-of-State-Cervidae six (6) months of age and older must have a negative brucellosis card or PCFIA test within sixty (60) days prior to entry.

Tuberculosis

1. Accredited Tuberculosis Free States

All cervidae twelve (12) months of age and over shall be negative to two (2) single cervical test for bovine TB no less than ninety (90) days apart with the second test conducted within ninety (90) days prior to entry. These animals shall be isolated from all other members of the herd during the testing period unless they originate from an accredited, qualified or monitored herd.

- A. Cervidae from an accredited herd may be moved into Illinois without further TB testing provided that a certificate stating that such cervids originated from an accredited herd accompanies them.
- B. Cervidae originating from qualified or monitored herds may enter with a negative test within ninety (90) days prior to entry and a certificate stating that the animals originate from a monitored herd.
- 2. Non-Accredited Tuberculosis Free Areas or States (Not TB Free)
 - A. All cervidae shall originate from a herd where a complete herd test was conducted within the past year.
 - B. The individual animals entering Illinois must be negative to two (2) additional truberculin tests conducted within 180 and 30 days prior to exhibition.

RATITES

(Ostriches, Emus, Rheas, Cassowaries and Kiwis)

Illinois Ratites

There are no requirements governing the movement of ratites within Illinois.

Out-of-State Ratites

- 1. Must be accompanied by a CVI and permit number. Entry permits are available by calling Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at 217/782-4944.
- 2. Individually identified by leg band or microchip.
- 3. Negative test for Avian Influenza within 10 days prior to entry.

PIGEONS

There are no requirements governing the movements of pigeons within or into Illinois.


RABBITS

There are no requirements governing the movements of rabbits within or into Illinois.

LLAMAS

There are no requirements governing the movements of llamas within Illinois. A permit and health certificate is required for out-of-state llamas. Entry permit numbers are available by calling the Illinois Department of Agriculture, Monday through Friday 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, at (217) 782-4944. 
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
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RULES AND REGULATIONS NOTICE — FAIR NOT RESPONSIBLE

The Directors of the Martinsville Agricultural Fair Association reserve the right to declare off the fair and withdraw all premiums offered should unforseen circumstances occur which in the judgement of the Directors would make it advisable to do so and all premiums offered and contracts made are made with that distinct understanding.

The Martinsville Agricultural Fair Association reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto and to add or amend these rules as they may deem advisable. Should any dispute as to meaning of any premium offered or as to any rule regarding the admission into or exclusion from the various classes. The meaning or construction of such a rule shall be left to the Board of Directors and their decision shall be final. By entering the exhibitor agrees to abide by each and every rule printed in this catalog.

No one to sell feed on grounds except authorized feed dealers

Arts Hall will be open on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

All exhibits at the fair grounds will be under the control of the Superintendent of its department and no exhibit can be removed from the fairgrounds until close of the Fair without permission in writing from the President and Secretary.

Care will be taken to prevent injury or loss to any animal or article exhibited, but the Fair Association will not be responsible for any damage or loss, should any occur.

A sufficient police force will always be on hand to prevent disorderly conduct of any kind.

Persons making themselves offensive to the officers or visitors of the Association will be excluded from the grounds at the discretion of the President.


Illinois Statutes provide a penalty of Ten (10) Dollars and costs for any person jumping the fence, and any one caught so doing will be duly arrested, taken to the city and fined for such offense.

All animals must be under control at all times by owner, trainer, or person in charge.

PUBLIC LAWS RELATING TO FAIRS — IN ILLINOIS —

Attention is called to the following section of laws passed by the legislature respecting Fairs. They will be strictly enforced.

Section 1. - Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois represented in the General Assembly: That no person shall keep any shop, booth, tent wagon or carriage or any article of traffic whatsoever, or sell or expose for sale, give, barter or otherwise dispose of or near such shop, booth, tent, wagon or carriage: vessel or boat in any other way or place, any spirits or other liquors or any provisions or any traffic whatsoever, at or within two miles from the place where any horticulture or mechanical fair or exhibition is held or shall any person within the distance aforesaid exhibit shows or plays unless the same shall be duly authorized by the proper authorities previous to the commencement of said exhibition; nor shall any person within the area aforesaid promote, aid or be engaged in the racing of animals or in gaming of any description; nor shall any person obstruct the passage of any highway or travelled road within the distance aforesaid: Provided that nothing in this act shall affect tavern keepers, distillers and others exercising their calling at their usual legitimate places of doing business, or any person who shall have a written permit from the president of such agricultural, mechanical or horticultural society or sell bread, or other provisions for the supply of persons at such fairs or exhibition, their horses or cattle, such persons attending, conforming to all of the regulations of said society and the laws of the state. Any person found guilty of a violation of the above section shall be fined not less than five dollars nor more than fifty.





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

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

FAIR HISTORY

The grounds of the Martinsville Agricultural Fair have a long, rich history. The Clark County Fair Association was formed in 1897 and the first fair was held in the early fall of that same year. Families came to spend the day, bringing picnic hampers and blankets to spread out while sharing lots of stories and laughs with their neighbors. Today families eat at the variety of food vendors instead of bringing a picnic basket but the fellowship with neighbors hasn't changed.

The Fair flourished until 1912 when it was largely destroyed by a tornado. After four years of recovery, the grounds were once again opened in 1917 and continued until the last Fair run by the Clark County Fair Association was held in 1930.

The previous fair site was purchased in 1944 by a group of interested people and shares were sold in the Martinsville Community Club. By 1945 the Club decided to deed the fairgrounds, about 29 acres, to the newly formed Martinsville Agricultural Fair Association. Under this new management the Fair opened once again on July 15, 1946. The Association continues to be the governing body of the Fair today and has been expanded to include 48 acres.

Horse racing has always been a major part of the Fair. The half-mile track was redesigned and resurfaced in 1965 and remains one of the premier facilities in the state for harness racing. The track is home to the first mile in two minutes (or faster) in Illinois county fair history for both trotters and pacers. Fifteen individuals have been involved with the Martinsville racing program and then subsequently inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Trotter in Goshen, IN. The Great Midwest Trot and Pace remain the fair's signature events, having been held annually since 1953. Because the Fair Association maintains a winterized racing track, thoroughbred and harness horses are boarded and trained on the grounds year around. The Martinsville track was where Dale Baird, Winningest Thoroughbred Trainer in History, got his start.

Throughout the years, the Board of Directors has upheld the founders' pledge in the Articles of Incorporation: "To encourage, promote and conduct civic, patriotic, athletic, education, agricultural and horticultural enterprises and events, and in furtherance to same but not in limitation thereof to furnish facilities for and to conduct an Agricultural Fair with exhibits of farm products, livestock, poultry and products of horticulture, floriculture, culinary and domestic arts; 4H Club work, school and education work, farm machinery; and in general to do all things usually done or furnished in and about the conduction of a Country Fair."

The Board has always been committed to maintaining and improving the grounds. There are five horse barns, a dairy barn, beef barn, hog barn and sheep barn to use in racing and livestock shows. In addition there is a horse arena that is used throughout the year by various horse clubs and an Arts Hall, used to promote agricultural and cultural education. Over the last few years two new pavilions and a handicap accessible area to the grandstands have been added; electrical upgrades to the midway area have been completed; the roof of the Arts Hall has been replaced and other buildings have been maintained and painted. In addition to the 4-H Fair, other events utilizing the grounds have included the Martinsville Heritage Days Festival/ Draft Horse Show; Farm Safety Program; Livestock Judging Program; the Firemen's Auxiliary's Haunted Barn; Firemen Training Programs, the circus, the Antique Power Club Show, the Clark County Health Department's used tire disposal collection point, reunions, auctions and more.

The Martinsville Agricultural Fair is known as a fair that promotes "Family Night, Every Night" by offering top entertainment and a State Fair quality carnival for families to enjoy at affordable prices. The Fair is one of Martinsville's greatest assets and the Board of Directors will continue to build on the rich heritage while partnering with organizations throughout the area to fully utilize what the grounds can offer.

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
